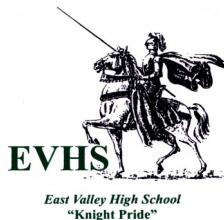

**East Valley High School Improvement Plan**

**Identified Needs/Goal Areas:**

- 1) EVHS will use the PLC process, with Horizontal Teams, to develop curriculum maps in all subject areas to increase student growth.
- 2) The staff will develop SMART Goals, identify Washington State Standards, develop common pre-assessments, and develop common formative assessments for each unit of study in every subject area.
- 3) The staff will differentiate instruction, develop enrichments and interventions, formulate common summative assessments, and analyze data.

**SMART Goals:**

- 1) East Valley High School will increase the number of 9<sup>th</sup> grade students meeting Reading standard by 13.7% as measured by the spring SRI assessment (from 63% to 77.4%).
  - a) Staff will interpret data to identify challenges that can be improved upon.
  - b) Staff will use the Data Pyramid to develop formative assessments to monitor student understanding.
  - c) There will be an emphasis on using Washington State Standards.
- 2) By June 2016, 50 % of 9<sup>th</sup> grade students who are serviced in Read 180, will improve their reading comprehension and fluency with a minimum of one year's growth as measured by SRI (Scholastic Reading Inventory)
  - a) Staff will use formative assessments to track student understanding on specific concepts taught.
  - b) Students will use computer software to develop their comprehension and vocabulary skills.
  - c) Students will use computer software to improve their fluency and spelling.

**Key Initiatives:**

East Valley High School is implementing some significant initiatives that will help improve academic success, keep our students and staff safe, and create better communication with our parents and community.

- 1) East Valley High School has developed a monthly Newsletter to better inform the community of upcoming events and positive highlights.
- 2) We are continuing to develop our LOC (Learning Opportunity Center) class, to help juniors and seniors recover credits so they can graduate on time.
- 3) We are developing intervention programs at the 9th grade level, to better support our new freshman class and reduce failure rate.
- 4) We are in the process of re-developing our Crisis Plan to better support our students, staff, and community; and to keep everyone safe.
- 5) We are continuing to improve our skills in using data to improve teaching and learning.
